Now in its third season, WCTE's newest locally produced series, Avery Hutchins, host and WCTE CEO, talked with Todd Mayo, the creative mind behind the hit PBS show, The Caverns Sessions; and she plumbed the depths of Darren Shell, an Overton County author, historian, folklorist and storyteller; and she travelled to the African-American community of Free Hill, in Clay County, the former home of local legend Bud Garrett, a talented musician and a self-taught inventor. In the previous two seasons, Avery explore the importance of Native American culture in the modern Upper Cumberland; visited with a mechanical engineer who persevered through homelessness; and local athlete who transitioned from sports to ballet; explored the experience of African American veterans in Putnam County, dating back to the Civil War; and documented the life journey of local resident and acclaimed singer/songwriter Darrell Scott.
