- #4 WCTE management personnel participated in several community events focusing on broadcast employment issues, to wit:

General Manager Becky Magura participated in a job fair at the Cookeville-Putnam County Chamber of Commerce on Broadcasting employment and Opportunities on May 18, 2008. She also presented at the same venue on Career Day for Cookeville High School, regarding careers and opportunities in public broadcasting, on October 21, 2008. Becky Magura also gave a presentation to area high school students at the Eyes of Diversity Banquet, regarding her career in public television and the employment opportunities available in broadcasting, on November 20, 2008.
